## Report 2014

The main activity of the network is the publication of the online-journal AnthroVision: <a href="http://anthrovision.revues.org/">http://anthrovision.revues.org/</a>. In 2014 two issues were publish, both on a special topic.

Vol. 2.1. was on "Anthropology and Digital Technologies". Citation from the Editorial: "This third issue of Anthrovision advocates the renewal of the writing process and the promotion of articles challenging the reconfiguration of our discipline, the evolution of the interactions between technological abilities and epistemological boundaries, the constraints of the confrontation between the expressions of creative research and the creation of new standards in an academic context. Without wishing to indulge a hedonistic perception of the Internet we would nonetheless like to draw attention to the crucial promises and challenges raised by these innovative narrative forms, in which imagination and creation must be combined with the issues contemporary societies are facing when dealing with the question of individual or collective representation."

Vol. 2.2. was on Digital Visual Engagements. Citation from the Introduction Do digital media formats enable new conceptual and collaborative practices? How do they allow us to challenge cinematic conventions or habitual understandings of the spatio-temporal arrangements of both ethnographic narrative and analytic insight? To what avail? This special issue is the result of conversations initiated around these questions on occasion of a co-convened panel at the Manchester IUAES conference in August 2013 (Evolving humanity, emerging worlds).
