

During 2016 the FAN EASA network changed the conveners. In September (after two months of transition) Debora Lanzeni and Karen Waltorp became the new conveners for two consecutive years. In the first six months of the year, the former conveners finished and published a book with Bloomsbury (<http://www.bloomsbury.com/uk/anthropologies-and-futures-9781474264907/>) that compiles the work of number of the FAN members. The introduction explores the network manifesto in light of research undertaken in dialogue with the FAN, since its drafting in Tallinn 2014. It is edited by Juan Salazar, Sarah Pink, Andrew Irving and Sjoberg (see cover book below).

In September FAN co-organize the workshop “Thinking with ethnography” along with CASTAC ([Committee on the Anthropology of Science, Technology, and Computing](#)) an official list of AAA and XCol ([Experimental Collaborations Ethnography beyond participant observation](#)). In the [4S/EASST CONFERENCE BARCELONA – 2016: Science and Technology by Other Means](#) framework. Taking the insights resulting from the workshop, we are currently working on the development of a special issue on ethnography, future, experimentation and anthropology of technology.

In the last three months, following the EASA biannual conference in Milan, some members of the network have been writing an application for the [COST](#) initiative along with the FAN conveners. We hope to apply for the 2016 call that due this December.

Beside the abovementioned, we are working hard to expand the list and include all EASA members who are interested in participating.
