

## Europeanist Network: Report of Activities in 2017

The Europeanist Network is an EASA network currently composed of approximately 80 members, most of them professors or researchers based at European universities. It has been established an independent network of EASA in 2004, on the occasion of the 8th EASA Conference held in Vienna. Its official EASA page can be consulted here:

Its last official network-panel took place on the occasion of the last EASA bi-annual conference held in Milano in July 2016, being entitled *Themes in the history of anthropology and ethnology in Europe* and having as conveners professors Andrés Barrera-González, from Universidad Complutense de Madrid, and Han F. Vermeulen, from Max Planck Institute of Social Anthropology. It reunited 12 papers, discussing interesting evolutions in the history of European anthropology with case-studies from Spain, Great Britain, Lithuania, Turkey, Russia, Romania or Germany.

Since then two important events took place for the network, namely the apparition of the first two volumes in the network's series at Berghahn Books, series entitled 'Anthropology of Europe':

1. *The France of the Little-Middles. A Suburban Housing Development in Greater Paris*, by Marie Cartier, Isabelle Coutant, Olivier Masclet, and Yasmine Siblot (and translated from French by Juliette Rogers), 224 pages, 9 illus., bibliog., index, published August 2016.
2. *European anthropologies*, an edited volume reunited by Andrés Barrera-González, Monica Heintz and Anna Horolets, 296 pages, 3 figures, 4 tables, bibliog., index, published August 2017.

Long awaited, this second volume makes an important contribution to the history of European anthropology. As the editors underline, 'By assessing the diversity of European intellectual histories within sociocultural anthropology, this volume aims to sketch its intellectual and institutional portrait. It will be a useful reading for the students of anthropology, ethnology, history and philosophy of science, research and science policy makers.' The introduction of both books can be freely consulted on Berghahn's site.
