Over the last two years, The Network of Anthropology of Religion, funded by Simon Coleman and Ramon Sarro in 2006, has continued to be a very active email list where information about relevant meetings, publications, etc is shared among its several hundred members. On 18 and 19 September 2017, thanks to the generous support of the EASA, together with local funding obtained in Lisbon (CRIA, ICS and FCT), a workshop entitled "Conviviality and its Discontents: Religious Pluralism in Contemporary Urban Settings" was celebrated in Lisbon, organized by Ruy Blanes, Jose Mapril and Ramon Sarro, three members of the Steering Committee of the network. The objective of the workshop was to find ways to investigate religious pluralism and to move beyond the strictures of monolithic approaches such as the anthropology of Islam or the anthropology of Christianity. It was successful and well attended, and EASA money became instrumental in allowing us to invite some EASA members from European countries. We thank EASA for having made it possible. Some interesting dialogues across universities are now emerging as an outcome of the workshop.
