Cet outil numérique, mis en ligne sur le site du MEG, en étant au plus près des descriptions d'Amoudruz, de ses dessins, de ses relevés cartographiques ou de ses photographies, recueillis directement sur le terrain, rend compte de l'importance de ce moment fondateur pour le folklore alpin.
