Call for Papers for the 7th APA Conference, Lisbon, June 2019. The 7th Conference of the Portuguese Anthropology Association (APA) takes place from 4 to 7 June 2019 in Lisbon, at NOVA University, Faculty of Social and Human Sciences. The call for papers is now open (and until the 7th January 2019). The conference includes the following two panels dedicated or related to the history of anthropology. (1) [**Rescued genealogies: pathways for a historiography of World Anthropologies**](#) (convenors: Patrícia Ferraz de Matos, Institute of Social Sciences, Lisbon University, and Frederico Delgado Rosa, NOVA University, Lisbon). Abstract: The panel seeks to contribute to a re-examination of anthropology's past in a broad sense, comprising ethnographic experiences that preceded the scientific institutionalization of the discipline or remained complementary to it, sometimes through experimentalism and amateurism in various, interwoven contexts. Apart from a post-colonial critique of past

attempts to survey and analyse human variability, the purpose is to understand them in their time and to reassess their place in the historical dynamics of anthropology. The panel is open to case studies focused on anthropological traditions (e.g. Lusophone and Iberian-American) that are peripheral, external or off-centre in relation to the so-called 'Major Traditions'. (2) [In the trail of spurious lineages: when anthropology learns to doubt its own founders](#) (convenors: Pâmela Marconatto Marques, Universidade Federal do Rio Grande do Sul, and Marília Floôr Kosby, Université de Liège). Abstract: It is proposed in this panel to outline an alternative composition of the anthropological-theoretical frameworks, bringing together narratives of anthropologists marked by the dissidence of hegemonic patterns of disciplinary production (non-whites, sexual dissidents, from subalternized contexts). It is, therefore, an exercise of refusing the garden of Eden with claims of purity (Haraway, 1991), based on the identification of spurious lines not recognized in the history of anthropology, marking their contributions to the debates that are dear to the development of the discipline and to the definition of its course.
